



Call for Participants

Are you a Canadian academic with Multiple Sclerosis?

A research study is currently underway investigating how Canadian academics with multiple sclerosis (MS) negotiate the workplace, including in gendered and socio-spatial ways. A goal of the study is to increase our understanding of these workers' experiences and employment-related decisions.

Interviews are being conducted with three groups of academics who have MS:

1. those who hold **full-time academic positions**;
2. those who hold **part-time and contractually-limited academic positions**; and
3. those who are **retired faculty members**.

Participating in an interview involves speaking with a researcher by phone for approximately 1.5 hours at a time of your convenience.

This study has been approved by the research ethics boards at Simon Fraser University and the University of Winnipeg.

This study is funded by the Social Sciences & Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) and led by researchers at Simon Fraser University (Valorie Crooks), Lakehead University (Sharon Dale Stone), and the University of Winnipeg (Michelle Owen).
